Do some research on Kiddle for ideas and create your own. |
| The toilet roll keepy-uppy challenge! Now there's plenty of it back in shops - how many can you do? | Choose a country, find it on a world map and learn 5 facts about it. Could you make a poster? | Create an Easter themed dictionary ... what words could you include? | Ask an adult to tell you a story about something they remember from when they were at school. |
